T03 finally has security of tenure. A 10+10-vear lease has been negotiated and executed. The expanded area comprises the entire title outlined in blue and a licenced area in red, which is a part of another title. The new lease provides options for development and design work for a Mitchell Range Master Plan has begun in earnest.

Thanks to Frank, the compressor now has an electric motor which significantly simplifies use of the device and pleasantly reduces noise levels.

Tas Police are currently using Range A for practice requirement for all officers in the Southern District. ## \$\$ To Audit or not to Audit \$\$

It was a long-standing requirement for SSAA branches to provide a professional audit of the books. The law changed and exempted an organisation with an income of less than \$250,000 from having to provide an audit to Consumer Affairs.

Our latest constitution reflects that change but for the past two years the committee decided to continue commissioning an accountant to provide an Auditor's Report. The cost to the club is now over \$1000 per report which is money the committee thinks could be better spent elsewhere and proposes that an in-house procedure of audit be developed and accepted by both committee and members.

The treasurer provides detailed reports to the committee each month and processes about 110 payments per year which is quite small. It should be possible to provide members before or at the AGM with acceptable or even better access to the books without a professional audit. The committee is keen to get feedback from members regarding this proposal so have a chat or send an email.

#### **Juniors Free**

Thanks to everyone for accepting the necessary increase in range fees this year. Quite a few regular members are taking advantage of the discounted shoot cards and annual pass. The committee has also decided to abolish range fees for juniors whether they are accompanied by a full paying member or not.

#### Pensioner?

A reminder that to be eligible for the \$10 pensioner concession rate, your SSAA Membership Card must be marked Pensioner rather than Adult in the bottom-right corner.

## **Signing Participation Cards**

Recognising Club Approval participation requirements, Participation Cards will only be signed after the holder has participated in a T03 shooting activity. A Range Officer or Club Official can sign the card only after they have witnessed the holder train or compete. Only a Club Official can sign if a witness is not available, and it is the opinion of the Club Official that the holder did participate in the club's shooting activity.



ANZAC Day falls on the fourth Tuesday of April which is a rostered BR 30 shoot. In recognition of the significance of the day and especially the morning, organisers have decided to cancel the shoot.
